

Appendix 2: Churchyard Inventory

Ickworth Churchyard



INTRODUCTION

1. Site conditions

This inventory was compiled following two site visits. The conditions on site imposed several constraints: On 15 August 2012 the scaffolding of the church was under construction and most of the churchyard was overgrown with nettles and brambles. On 13 September 2012, the churchyard had been cleared of nettles and brambles, and several trees had been felled. However, the scaffolding and its surrounding hoarding precluded access to a few headstones and footstones close to the church (as marked in the inventory). By then, the south churchyard wall and part of the east wall had been taken down in preparation for rebuilding. Where possible, the information gathered during these two site visits were complemented by observations made, and photos taken, during previous visits in October and November 2011.

2. Information recorded

This inventory is based on information compiled during the visits in August and September 2012, complemented by the transcripts of inscriptions recorded in two previous inventories: the transcript of 1891 by Sydenham Hervey Augustus Hervey (SHAH) (published in *Ickworth Parish Registers: Baptisms, Marriages and Burials, 1566 to 1890* (1894)), which was continued and updated in 1985 by Margrid Brooks (MB) (manuscript list in the Church Commissioners' file for Ickworth). These two previous inventories only recorded the inscriptions of the headstones, without any reference plan. They have been consulted in cases where the inscription has since become illegible. Caution is advised, however, as the spelling in SHAH is not always entirely correct. A sketch plan made in 1972 identified 45 gravestones by surname only.¹ This was useful in identifying some illegible inscription, together with the records by SHAH and MB.

The numbers in the left column refer to the reference plan (see below) and the numbers in the inventories compiled by SHAH and MB (a number preceded by their initials). The photos show, where possible, the front and back of each headstone or monument. Several headstones are currently illegible, either due to erosion, the delamination of the stone or being overgrown. They may, in time, be identified as one of the unidentified memorials from Hervey's and Brooks's lists (see list of unidentified memorials below).

Most inscriptions are on the west-facing side of the headstone. Inscriptions have been recorded as accurately as possible, with a forward slash '/' marking a line break. Three dots ('...') mark illegible or lost parts of inscriptions. In many cases, the footstones are set against the headstone. In these cases, the headstone is given the letter a and the footstone the letter b, e.g. 7a and b. Many memorials are covered in lichen, moss and liverwort. These have only been noted where they obscure the inscription or visibly affect the condition of the stone. As noted in Appendix 1,

churchyards present an important habitat for these plants and they should be retained. As the clearing of the churchyard was still in progress during the compiling of the inventory, no ground variations such as mounds or depressions which may point to unmarked graves were recorded.

3. Unidentified headstones

Several headstones and footstones which are known to be found in the churchyard remain unidentified due to illegible or overgrown inscriptions.

- Mary, wife of George H.W. Hervey and daughter of William Wells Cole, born 22 Feb. 1858, died 21 Oct 1909 (MB58)

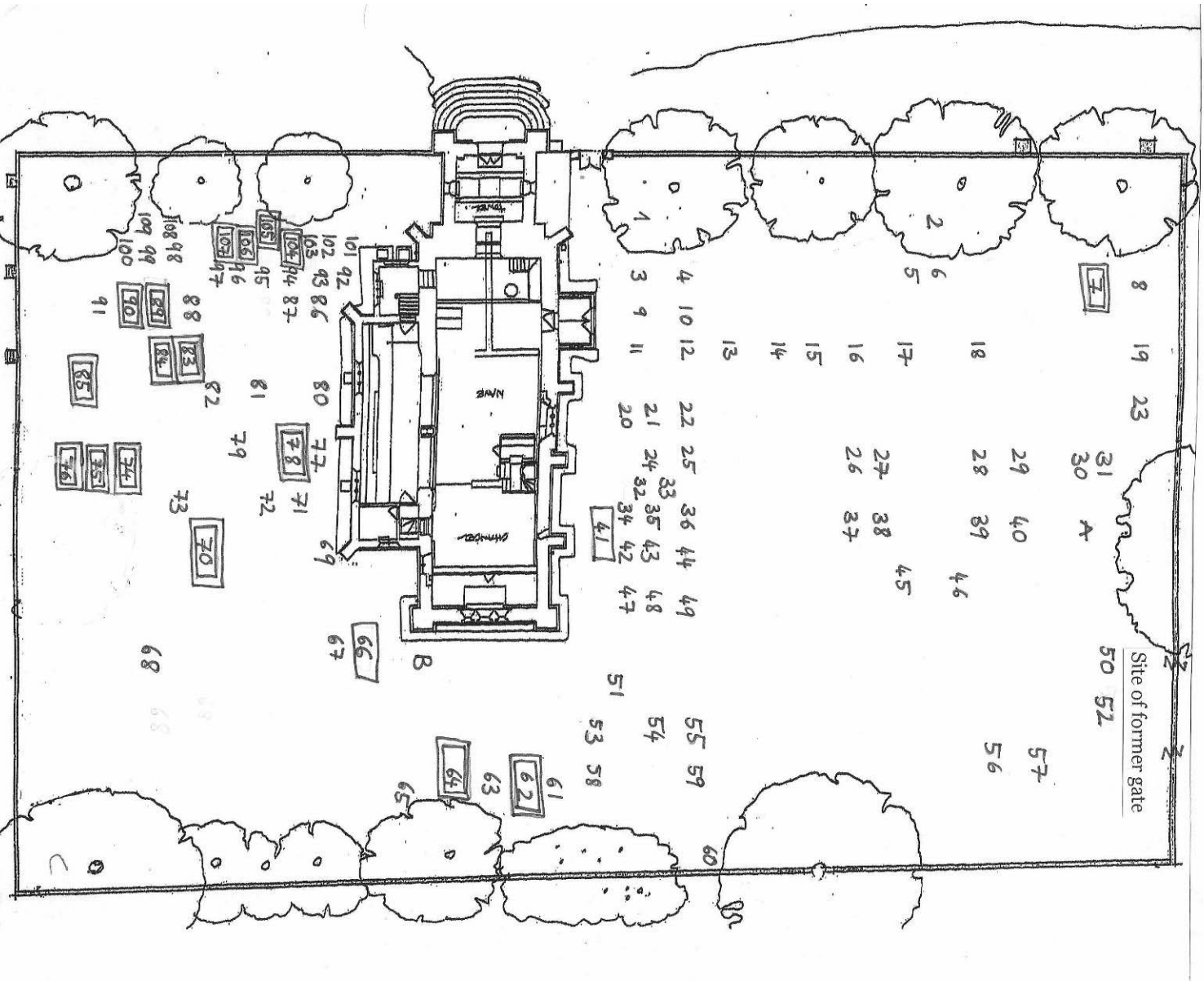
South side

- Lydia, wife of James Howe, died 17 December 1824 (SHAH 44)
- Sarah Curtis, died 10 December 1944; and John Curtis, died 7 October 1958 (MB 63)
- William Edward Howlett, born 24 April 1873, died 30 June 1933 (MB 81)


